WALAILAK UNIVERSITY

THE IMPLEMENTATION OF THE MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING
BETWEEN THE UNIVERSITY OF MATARAM, INDONESIA AND WALAILAK
UNIVERSITY, THAILAND, UNDERSIGNED ON 08/07/2022

Prof. Dr Muhammad Sood, Head of the Department of International Relations, the University of Mataram, hereinafter referred to as 'First Party'

and

Prof. Dr. Wanna Choorit, Acting Dean of School of Political Science and Public Administration, Walailak University, hereinafter referred to as 'Second Party',

and both are collectively known as 'Parties', to achieve and establish various goals relating to:

Section A
Aim and Scope

Article 1
Aims

This agreement is set forth to succeed and enhance cooperation between the undersigned parties.

Article 2
Scope

The scope of this agreement covers various activities including student exchange, faculty members' exchange, collaborative research, joint conference and seminar, publication plans in any possible means, community development, and other activities agreed upon by the two parties.

Section B
Implementation

Article 3
Student Exchange

1. Undersigned parties may assign their students for an exchange program in the duration of one semester or less
2. The number of students engaged in an exchange will be determined later between two parties
3. Courses are conducted in either offline or online classes, depending on the agreement between parties, and other pressing situations such as the pandemic.
4. Assessment of the result of the study will refer to both numeric and alphabetic grading systems.
5. Assessment of the result of the study will refer to the *Standard Operating Procedure* (SOP) of the parties involved.
6. In case there are variations in the grading system between parties, any grades achieved will be converted so that they will suit the system used by the student-sending party.

Article 4
Faculty Members' Exchange

1. Exchange of faculty members is possible upon agreement by both parties, following a need-based assessment of each party and the expertise of faculty members.
2. The number of individual faculty members bound for exchange, or visiting faculty members, is decided upon agreement between parties.
3. Courses offered and delivered by visiting faculty members are decided upon agreement between parties.
4. Visiting faculty members follow the standard operating procedure of the receiving party.

Article 5
Research Collaboration

1. Undersigned parties agreed upon research collaboration programmes.
2. The collaborative research code of conduct and ethical procedure will follow the standard set forth by the funding agency.

Article 6
Joint Conference and Seminar

1. Undersigned parties agreed to collaborate on conducting a joint conference and seminar, upon further agreement.
2. Undersigned parties agreed to collaborate on assigning resource persons and speakers for joint conferences and seminars

Article 7
Publication

1. Undersigned parties agreed to conduct a collaborative publication plan and exchange of knowledge with regard to publication strategies.
2. The publication mentioned in point 1 may include peer-reviewed journals, science blogs, working papers, and popular articles.

Article 8
Community Development and Cultural Exchange

1. Undersigned parties agreed to collaborate in conducting joint community development and cultural exchange programmes.
2. The sites of the community development and cultural exchange programmes may take place in Indonesia and/or Thailand, following the existing and agreed community development and cultural programmes.

Section C
Terms and Condition, Duration, and Funding

Article 9
Terms and Condition

1. This agreement follows the principle of reciprocity, in which undersigned parties maintain a balanced and shared responsibility for the implementation process
2. Upon the agreement of activities, undersigned parties will form/assign organisers from each institution to discuss the technical implementation process.

Article 10
Duration

1. This agreement will take effect for 5 (five) years, beginning on the date of signing
2. Parties may extend this agreement should the duration is about to expire.
3. In case either undersigned party wishes to terminate any terms in this agreement before the expiration date, one shall notify the other party.

Article 11
Funding

Financial spending incurred upon the implementation of this agreement is subject to further deliberation.

Section D
Conclusion

Article 12
Closing

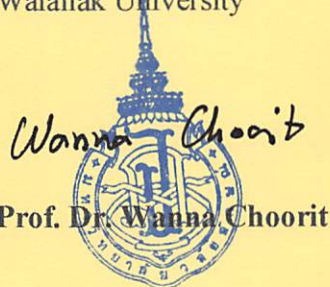
1. Issues or collaborative programmes that fall outside of the scope of this agreement are subject to further discussion between parties.
2. In case of *force majeure* such as natural disasters, riots, and other externally induced problems which may harm the implementation of this agreement, parties agreed to find the solution upon further talks.
3. Dispute settlement between parties is subject to further deliberation and is to be held in cooperative manner.
